The event is produced by Book-MyShow Live in collaboration with Live Nation and the Assam government. This performance marks Malone's debut stadium show in the region, following his appearance in Mumbai in 2022 for a charitable event.

Elderly man killed over food dispute in Uttar Pradesh

HATHRAS, 17 SEPT A man has been arrested for allegedly murdering a 75-year-old villager in Uttar Pradesh's Hathras district following a dispute over food, officials reported on Wednesday. The body of Dorilal Upadhyay was discovered in a field in Kevalgarhi village on 13 September, displaying severe injuries. His son, Hariom, filed a complaint that led to the registration of a case. Senior police officials visited the scene with a forensic team, prompting the formation of multiple investigative teams.

Brother, his wife kill man, pass it off as accident

NAGPUR, 17 SEPT. A man and his wife have been arrested in connection with the suspected murder of his brother, whose death was initially passed off as an accident. The 40-year-old victim was discovered dead in the bathroom of his home at Eros Society in Shiv Nagar on 2 September. The family claimed he had fallen and sustained a head injury, but a post-mortem revealed severe head injuries consistent with assault, according to an official from Mankapur police station. "There was tension among family members due to the deceased's drinking habits,"

Farmers burning stubble must be arrested, says SC

Instead of burning, stubble can be re-purposed as biofuel: SC

Concerned over the usual spike in pollution levels in winter, the Supreme Court asked the Punjab government on Wednesday why some errant farmers should not be arrested for indulging in stubble burning, a key contributor to air pollution, to send across a stern message.

The court heard a suo-motu plea relating to filling up vacancies in the state pollution control boards of Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Rajasthan and Punjab.

The court asked these states, the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) and the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) to fill up vacancies within three months.

Stubble burning is a practice in vogue among farmers to quickly clear their fields for the next sowing cycle.

The court said stubble, instead of being burnt, can be



re-purposed as biofuel and insisted that the state must consider stricter punitive provisions if it is genuinely committed to environmental protection.

The counsel for Punjab government said that several steps had been taken and the number of stubble-burning incidents has decreased from 77,000 to 10,000 in recent years. He said arresting small farmers, who till around one hectare of land, could dispropor-

tionately impact them and their dependents would suffer. Stubble burning is prohibited under the Environment Protection Act, which does not prescribe penalties and rather the CAQM Act provides for action against erring officials. Senior advocate and amicus curiae Aparajita Singh said despite subsidies, equipment and repeated orders of the apex court since 2018, the ground situation has not improved substantially.

SC reverses order on Haryana Village Commons

NEW DELHI, 17 SEPT

The Supreme Court has set aside its April 2022 decision directing that the village common lands in Haryana be returned to gram panchayats. The top court had held that the in respect to land taken from the proprietors, the management and control would vest with the panchayat. It upheld a Punjab and Haryana High Court ruling, which had held that land not earmarked for common purposes during consolidation would vest with proprietors, not the panchayat or the state.

SC CANCELS BAIL TO CHHOTA RAJAN IN 2001 MURDER

The Supreme Court on Wednesday cancelled the bail granted to gangster Chhota Rajan in the 2001 murder case of hotelier Jaya Shetty in Mumbai.

The court allowed the CBI's appeal challenging a Bombay High Court order, suspending the life sentence of Rajan

and granted him bail. Rajan remained absconding for 27 years and was convicted in four cases.

Rajan's counsel argued it was a case of no evidence. Of the 71 cases, the CBI did not find any material against him in 47 cases.

After his counsel said Rajan was acquitted in several cases, the court said the

acquittals were due to the reason that witnesses did not come forward. The court noted he was serving sentence for the murder of veteran crime reporter J Dey.

In 2024, a special court convicted Rajan in the hotelier's murder case and sentenced him to life imprisonment. He later approached the high court.

Govt examines claims of arms struggle suspension by Maoists

The outlawed CPI (Maoist) has announced a temporary suspension of its armed struggle to facilitate peace talks, but has asked the government to declare a one-month 'cease-fire' and halt security operations to initiate the process.

The Chhattisgarh government said it was verifying the authenticity of the statement, which surfaced on social media on

The rebels appealed to the government to share their decision on the issue via the internet and government news media, including radio.

The two-page statement, dated 15 August, was issued in the name of Abhay, a spokesperson of the central committee of Maoists, and came nearly four months after the killing of Nambala Keshav Rao alias Basavaraju, general secretary of the Communist Party of India (Maoist), in an encounter with security forces in Chhattisgarh's Bastar region.

Deputy Chief Minister Vijay Sharma said the best way for Maoists is to surrender and avail rehabilitation benefits.



The Maoists had earlier proposed a ceasefire to the government. However, the Centre intensified its operations against them

Naxalites kill man in Chhattisgarh

BIJAPUR, 17 SEPT

Naxalites hacked a man to death in Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district, suspecting him of being a police informer. A group of Naxalites barged into

Dashru Ram Oyam's house on 16 September, dragged him outside and killed him with axes.

The police have launched search operation in the area to track down the killers.

The term 'ceasefire' is highly objectionable as there is no war-like situation that requires one, he said. The Maoists had proposed a

ceasefire to the government earlier. However, the central government intensified its operations, they said.

HC DISMISSES PLEA AGAINST 'JOLLY LLB 3'

The Bombay High Court on Wednesday dismissed a plea against Akshay Kumar and Arshad Warsi's courtroom drama "Jolly LLB 3", alleging mockery of judges and lawyers, noting the court was used to such mockery.

"Don't worry about us," the HC said.

The petition filed by the Association for Aiding Justice through advocate Chandrakant Gaikwad sought a stay on the release of the movie and also deletion of the song, "Bhai Vakeel Hai", claiming it to be derogatory towards the legal profession.

The petitioner's lawyer, Dipesh Siroya, said the movie and song make a mockery of not just lawyers but also judges, as they are referred to as "mamu", a slang, which was derogatory and insulting.

The court appeared amused and said it was not worried about the same.

The filmmakers informed the bench that a similar plea against the movie was filed before the Allahabad High Court, and the same was dismissed.

PM Modi to Launch ₹45,000-Crore Nuclear Power Project in Banswara on Sept 25

Jaipur/Banswara: Prime Minister Narendra Modi is scheduled to visit Banswara on September 25 to lay the foundation stone of India's largest nuclear power project, worth approximately 45,000 crore. The project is being developed near the Mahi Dam on the Rajasthan-Madhya Pradesh border as part of the country's ambitious nuclear energy mission. During his visit, the Prime Minister is also expected to visit the Tripura Sundari Temple, one of the prominent Shakti Peeths, and address a large public gathering. Preparations for the event are underway under the supervision of the government and the BJP.

In addition to the nuclear project, PM Modi may inaugurate or lay foundation stones for other developmental projects in Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh. Official details on these additional projects are expected soon.

Earlier Visit to Rajasthan

This will be the Prime Minister's second visit to Rajasthan this year. On May 22, he visited Deshnook in Bikaner after Operation Sindoor, where he offered prayers at the Karni Mata Temple, inaugurated the modernised railway station, and addressed a public gathering in Palana village. During that visit, PM Modi recalled the Pahalgaon terror attack and praised the Indian Army for compelling Pakistan to yield. He said, "Pakistan forgot that Mother India's servant Modi stands tall today. My mind is calm, but my blood is hot. My veins flow with the hot sindoor."

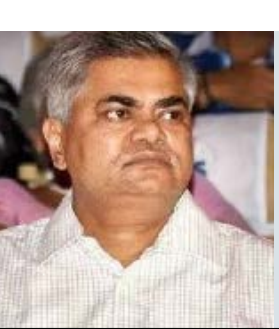

सुप्रीम कोर्ट ने प्रदूषण बोर्ड में भर्ती के लिए दिए तीन माह

जयपुर। राष्ट्रीय राजधानी क्षेत्र में प्रदूषण से जुड़े एक महत्वपूर्ण मामले में, सुप्रीम कोर्ट ने राजस्थान सरकार को बड़ी राहत दी है। न्यायालय ने राजस्थान के मुख्य सचिव को हलफनामा स्वीकार करते हुए राज्य प्रदूषण नियंत्रण बोर्ड में सीधी भर्ती के खाली पदों को भरने के लिए तीन महीने का अतिरिक्त समय दिया है। हालांकि, कोर्ट ने राजस्थान की ओर से दी गई दलीलों को मानते हुए पदोन्नति से भरे जाने वाले पदों को इस समय सीमा से बाहर रखा है। दरअसल, 8 मई 2025 को सुप्रीम कोर्ट की मुख्य न्यायाधीश और न्यायमूर्ति विनोद चंद्रन की पीठ ने प्रदूषण नियंत्रण बोर्डों में रिक्तियों को भरने के लिए 30 अप्रैल 2025 की समयसीमा का पालन न करने पर राजस्थान सहित कई राज्यों के मुख्य सचिवों को अवमानना नोटिस जारी किया था। इसके जवाब में, राजस्थान



के मुख्य सचिव ने कोर्ट में एक हलफनामा दायर किया। राजस्थान की ओर से पेश हुए अतिरिक्त महाधिक्कता शिव मंगल शर्मा ने कोर्ट को बताया कि राज्य प्रदूषण नियंत्रण बोर्ड में कुल 808 स्वीकृत पदों में से लगभग 70% पद पहले ही भरे जा चुके हैं। उन्होंने स्पष्ट किया कि केवल 250 पद ही रिक्त हैं, जिनमें से 175 पद पदोन्नति से भरे जाने हैं। सुप्रीम कोर्ट ने राजस्थान, पंजाब, हरियाणा और उत्तर प्रदेश राज्यों को यह भी निर्देश दिया है कि वे शपथपत्र दाखिल कर बताएं कि दिवाली के दौरान बढ़ने वाले प्रदूषण को नियंत्रित करने के लिए वे कौन-कौन से ठोस कदम उठाएंगे।

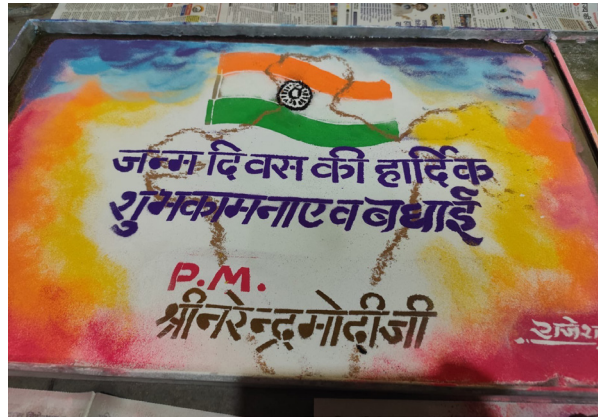

Fake Cattle Feed Racket Busted in Chittorgarh, Trader Files Complaint

Chittorgarh: A case of fake cattle feed supply has come to light in the district. Ramsahay Maliwal, a resident of Ayodhyapuri and proprietor of Rajaram Traders, lodged a complaint at the Kotwali police station. Maliwal is an authorized dealer of cottonseed cattle feed under the Mohanbhog trademark. He stated that he had received information about fake feed being sold in Chittorgarh under the guise of the original product.



HOW THE COUNTERFEIT WAS DETECTED

- Genuine sacks carry the line "This Packaging Material Manufactured by MULTILEAP PACKAGING, Lajai", while the fake ones read "MULTILEAP PACKAGING - Lajai" with a clear spelling error.
- The genuine feed bags display the trademark number 1377925 prominently, whereas on the counterfeit it was hidden within a watermark to appear authentic.
- The dash (-) mark used in the 2024-25 batch coding also differed—thin on genuine, thick on fake.
- On the original packaging, the name "Mohan Bhog" is printed in light yellow, while the fake shows it in a darker shade.
- The warning text was also different—the genuine one reads "Beware of fake and similar products", while the fake one says "Beware of fake and similar names."
- The six small icons printed beneath the trademark number were also different in the counterfeit sacks.

Acting on the tip, Ramsahay, along with his associates Amit Jain and Kailash Bhandari, reached the spot and inspected a pickup truck loaded with about 50 sacks of cattle feed. At first glance, the packaging looked original, but upon closer inspection, several discrepancies were found that exposed the fake goods.

Accusation Against Mavli-based Company

During questioning, pickup driver Rahul Yadav revealed that he had sourced the feed from Siddharth Trading Company, Mavli. According to him, he had been delivering this feed in Chittorgarh on the instructions of company owner Shubham Chhajed. Maliwal further informed police that he has been appointed as an authorized agent by Virchand Narsi Company to investigate and take legal action against counterfeit products in the Chittorgarh region. He has demanded strict action against Siddharth Trading Company and others involved in this racket. The police have registered the complaint, seized the truckload of feed, and initiated further investigation.

Counterfeit Currency Racket Busted in Chittorgarh, 3 Arrested

Chittorgarh: Kotwali police busted a counterfeit currency racket, arresting three youths from Kota and Jhalawar districts for circulating fake 500 notes. The gang, posing as tourists, was caught after a woman vendor in the main vegetable market identified one suspect who repeatedly paid with fake notes. Shopkeepers nabbed him and informed police, leading to

the recovery of 30 counterfeit notes.

The accused — Asif Ali, Adil Khan, and Shah Nawaz Khan — were found operating from a hotel. Asif, identified as the mastermind, had identical serial-numbered notes. Police said they targeted small vendors for easy transactions. The trio is on three-day remand as investigators track their supplier. Authorities urged traders to remain vigilant and report suspicious notes immediately.

Rajasthan Women's Cricket Squad Announced

Jaipur: The Rajasthan Cricket Association's (RCA) ad-hoc committee on Wednesday announced the 20-member Rajasthan Senior Women's team for the 2025-26 BCCI domestic season. The squad was finalized by the Women's Selection Committee after reviewing performances in the Senior Women's Trophy, Challenger Trophy, and a preparatory training camp.



Ad-hoc committee convener D.D. Kumawat said the team represents a mix of experienced players and emerging talents, reflecting Rajasthan's growing cricketing depth. Merit, consistency, and temperament were key selection criteria.

Senior Assistant of Rajgarh Municipal Council Arrested for Taking ₹1.90 Lakh Bribe

Jaipur: In a major crackdown on corruption, the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) has arrested a senior assistant of Rajgarh Municipal Council, Churu district, red-handed while accepting a bribe of ₹1,90,000.

According to Smita Srivastava, Additional Director General of Police, Anti-Corruption Bureau, the Jhunjhunu ACB unit carried out the operation following a complaint. The complainant had submitted a file for the conversion of a vacant plot of land at the Rajgarh Municipal Council. The accused, Rakesh Dhayal, Senior Assistant and in charge of the Land Branch, allegedly demanded a bribe of ₹3 lakh in addition to the official conversion fee. During confidential verification on September 16, 2025, it was found that Dhayal, in collusion with draftsman Pawan Mudral, sought ₹96,500 as official conversion fees along with an additional ₹1 lakh as bribe. Acting upon the verified complaint, a trap was organized. On Thursday, the accused was caught accepting ₹1,90,000 in cash from the complainant, which was recovered from his office table.

150 Wards, One City: Jaipur Civic Delimitation Finalised

Jaipur: The Rajasthan government has completed the delimitation process for the Jaipur Municipal Corporation following the merger of Jaipur Heritage and Greater Jaipur six months ago. The new civic body will now have 150 wards, with boundaries drawn on the basis of population. An official gazette notification is expected soon.

Merger and Public Consultation
After announcing the merger of the two corporations earlier this year, the state government invited public objections and suggestions on ward demarcations. Once these inputs were reviewed and addressed, the delimitation proposal was approved and finalised.

Upcoming Elections

The terms of the erstwhile Jaipur Heritage and Greater Jaipur corporations end in November. Under the state's "One State, One Election" plan, polls for all municipal corporations are likely to be held together, possibly early next year.

Largest and Smallest Wards

According to the final plan, Ward 135 has emerged as the largest with a population of 32,272, while Ward 31 is the smallest, housing 13,499 people. This differs from the earlier draft plan in which Ward 19 was the largest (37,711) and Ward 132 the smallest (10,371).

Reservation Process

Following the gazette notification, the District Election Office will fix reservations for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes based on ward populations. Subsequently, reservations for OBCs and women will be allocated through a lottery process conducted jointly by the Department of Local Self-Government and the District Election Office.
