Trump, Melania endure UN mishap, glitch

New York, September 23, 2025, U.S. President Donald Trump's high-profile appearance at the United Nations General Assembly began with unexpected drama, as both he and First Lady Melania Trump encountered a pair of unusual mishaps that quickly captured global attention.

Upon arriving at the UN headquarters, Trump and Melania stepped onto an escalator that suddenly came to a halt. Video footage showed the First Lady, dressed elegantly in a white pantsuit, steadying herself on the railing while the President followed just behind. With the escalator stalled, the couple continued their way on foot, while aides and security diverted others to a nearby



staircase. The brief stoppage, though harmless, sparked a flurry of comments online, with many users jokingly calling it a "symbolic moment."

The day's second glitch

came during Trump's address to the General Assembly. Just minutes into his speech, the teleprompter failed, forcing him to pause mid-sentence. Trump lightened the mood

with his characteristic humor, quipping: "I don't mind making this speech without a teleprompter, because the teleprompter is not working." He added with a grin, "Whoever runs the teleprompter is in big trouble." Trump went further, using the mishaps as a jab at the UN itself. "These are the two things I got from the United Nations: a bad escalator and a bad teleprompter," he remarked, drawing laughter in the hall. He even joked that if Melania were not in great shape, she might have fallen when the escalator stopped.

While Trump's speech later addressed serious topics - from global security to climate policy - it was the pair of technical glitches that became the most replayed and talked-about moments of the day.

Hungary Refuses to Halt Russian Oil Imports Despite NATO Pressure

Budapest, September 23, 2025 — Hungary's Foreign Minister Péter Szijjártó has firmly rejected demands from NATO and the United States to cut off Russian oil and gas imports, insisting that the country's energy security cannot be compromised.

Speaking after U.S. President Donald Trump urged NATO allies to stop purchasing Russian energy as part of new sanctions, Szijjártó said such expectations were "unrealistic" and described them as "nice dreams." He stressed that Hungary is landlocked and heavily dependent on pipeline supplies, leaving it with no quick alternatives. "Energy supply is not ideology, it is physics. If we cut Russian oil and gas today, Hungarians will freeze tomorrow," he declared. Hungary



has maintained long-term contracts with Moscow for crude oil and natural gas, mostly delivered through the Soviet-era Druzhba pipeline. While other European states have diversified away from Russian energy, Budapest argues that building the infrastructure needed to switch suppliers would take years and billions of euros. The minister also criticized what he called the "fanatical approach" of some Western governments, accusing them of ignoring the practical challenges faced by Central European countries.

Yogi Adityanath Claims Hindu Population Declined Sharply Due to Invaders' Atrocities

Lucknow, September 23, 2025 Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has sparked debate with his recent remarks at a Swadeshi Sankalp workshop. He claimed that India's Hindu population, which he said stood at nearly 600 million (60 crore) around the year 1100, declined to 300 million (30 crore) by the time of Independence in 1947. According to Adityanath, this decline was not only the result of foreign invasions but also due to famine, disease, and large-scale exploitation. He alleged that "invaders' atrocities" over centuries weakened the demographic strength of Hindus and caused severe disruptions in India's social fabric. The Chief Minister emphasized that strengthening the Swadeshi (indigenous) movement and promoting local industries is the way to reverse historical injustices and build a truly self-reliant

India. He argued that forces attempting to divide society on caste, language, and regional lines still carry the mentality of "foreign invaders" and stand opposed to India's cultural unity. While his remarks resonated with certain sections of supporters, historians and demographers have raised questions over the accuracy of his numbers. Population estimates for medieval India remain uncertain, with limited verifiable data available. Experts note that demographic reconstructions from a millennium ago cannot be cited with the same precision as modern censuses, making such claims largely political rather than statistical. Still, Adityanath's statement has amplified discussion on India's past, cultural identity, and the role of Swadeshi economics in shaping the country's future. For many, the controversy reflects the ongoing tension between historical narratives and present-day politics.

Shrikant Badwe Joins India's Billionaires Club with Bellatrix Industries' Growth Story

Rajasthan High Court Hears Appeals in Salman Khan Blackbuck Poaching Case

Jaipur, September 23, 2025 — The Rajasthan High Court today conducted hearings in the high-profile blackbuck poaching case, which involves Bollywood superstar Salman Khan along with actors Saif Ali Khan, Tabu, Sonali Bendre, and Neelam. The case, which dates back to the 1998 incidents during the filming of Hum Saath-Saath Hain in Rajasthan, has drawn significant national and international media attention.

The state government

has filed an appeal against a lower court's decision to acquit Saif Ali Khan, Tabu, Sonali Bendre, and Neelam, arguing that justice must be served for the illegal killing of the endangered blackbuck species. Prosecutors highlighted that the acquittal of the actors in the lower court undermines wildlife protection laws under the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972, which classifies blackbucks as a protected species.

During the proceedings, the High Court bench emphasized the need to bal-



ance due process with stringent enforcement of environmental and wildlife regulations. Legal experts note that the hearings could set a precedent in In-

dia for how cases involving high-profile individuals and wildlife crimes are adjudicated. Salman Khan, who was separately convicted and sentenced to jail

in this case in the past, continues to face scrutiny for his role in the hunting incident. The appeals in the High Court aim to review both the legal reasoning of the lower court and the adequacy of penalties imposed.

Environmental groups and wildlife activists have closely followed the proceedings, expressing hope that the judicial system will reinforce the importance of protecting endangered species. The outcome of the High Court's decision is ex-

pected to have broader implications for wildlife law enforcement in India, sending a strong message regarding compliance with conservation regulations. The case remains a key example of the intersection of celebrity, legal accountability, and environmental conservation, capturing public attention across the country. The High Court is expected to deliver its verdict in the coming weeks, following detailed arguments from both the prosecution and defense.

American Woman Receives ₹50 Hospital Bill for Emergency Treatment in India

Jaipur, September 23, 2025 — An American tourist received a surprisingly low hospital bill after visiting an emergency ward in India for medical treatment, sparking discussions about the country's affordable healthcare system. The patient, who asked to remain anonymous, was treated at a government hospital for a minor injury and was charged just 50 (approximately \$0.60 USD) for the entire visit, including consultation and basic tests. According to hospital officials, the woman was admitted to the emergency ward late in the evening with a minor cut on her arm. Doctors imme-

diately treated the wound, cleaned and dressed it, and prescribed basic medication. Despite the efficiency and quality of care, the hospital's nominal charges reflect India's policy of providing subsidized healthcare for both residents and foreign visitors in government facilities. The American visitor expressed her astonishment on social media, writing that the experience "felt surreal," given the high cost of emergency care in the United States. "In my country, a similar visit could easily cost hundreds of dollars. Here, the treatment was fast, professional, and virtually free," she said.

Schemes Should Reach Every Individual Through Camps: Alok

Chittorgarh: The weekly review meeting held on Monday at the District Council's Rural Development Agency auditorium was chaired by District Collector Alok Ranjan. In the meeting, he gave clear instructions to the officials that delivering the benefits of various welfare schemes of the state government to the maximum number of eligible people is the top priority of the administration. For this purpose, the ongoing rural service camps and urban service camps are proving to be a strong medium to provide immediate relief and convenience to the public. The Collector said that timely resolution of people's problems in the camps must be ensured, and any kind of negligence in this



regard will not be tolerated. He emphasized that officials and employees should work with seriousness and sensitivity during the camps so that the public can receive the real benefits of the government's schemes. In the meeting, the Collector gave detailed information that various departments are providing services in the camps including Medical and Health, Tribal Area Development, Labour, Industries, Education, Social Welfare, Sainik Welfare, Planning, Social Justice and Empowerment, Water

Supply, Energy, Cooperation, Food and Civil Supplies, Water Resources, Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Revenue, Animal Husbandry, Agriculture, Forest, and Women and Child Development. Through these departments, along with the benefits of schemes, the general public is also being provided necessary certificates, pensions, financial assistance, and other services promptly. During the meeting, District Collector Alok Ranjan reviewed the progress of Kusum A, B, and C schemes with the Elec-

tricity Department. Similarly, he reviewed the condition of road repairs and maintenance with the Public Works Department. He also reviewed the works included in budget announcements and the progress of flagship schemes of other departments and gave necessary directions to the officials to complete these works within the stipulated time. While discussing the pending cases registered on the Sampark Portal, the Collector instructed the officials to resolve these cases promptly and

Hailing from Jodhpur, he has published over 30 international and 70 national research papers. Professor Sushil Kumar Bissu, a native of Ajmer, holds an MSc and PhD in Mathematics and brings nearly 33 years of teaching experience. He has published 35 research papers and has been associated with the academic committees and boards of several universities, according to an official.

Gehlot demands PM's comment on delayed justice to Kanhaiya Lal's family BJP says he was CM then

Jaipur: Former Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot on Tuesday said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who is set to visit the state on September 25, should make a statement on the delayed justice to slain tailor Kanhaiya Lal's family. Kanhaiya Lal was murdered by two cleaver-wielding men inside his shop in Udaipur in 2022 for allegedly insulting Islam. Addressing a press conference in Jaipur, Gehlot reiterated his allegation that the main accused were linked to the BJP. "It is a mystery why there has been no significant progress in the case despite being investigated by the National Investigation Agency (NIA). The Prime Minister should make a statement on delayed justice to Kanhaiya Lal's family during his Banswara visit," he said. Gehlot was the chief



minister when the incident happened. Two accused were apprehended a few hours into the murder, yet the case was later transferred to the NIA. He said the BJP defamed the then Congress government in spite of the accused being arrested, a compensation of Rs 50 lakh being paid to the family, and both sons of the slain tailor being given government jobs. Gehlot said the BJP leaders gave it a communal colour, while his government had never discriminated on religious lines in any matter.

The former chief minister also showed photographs of the accused with senior BJP leader Gulab Chand Kataria, who is now the Punjab Governor, and said the accused were associated with the BJP. He claimed the accused would have been hanged by now if the case was investigated by the state police instead of the NIA. Gehlot said he visited Udaipur and met the family of Kanhaiya Lal. "The family is awaiting justice. I had expected home minister Amit Shah to make a statement on the

Kyfesto's strength, regulars and visitors agree, lies not just in the beans or brewing technique but in the entire experience: carefully crafted filter coffees (V60, AeroPress, French press), a consistently refreshing cold brew and a menu of drinks that favour clarity of flavour over gimmicks. "You can tell the team cares about the roast and extraction—the coffee arrives with bright notes and a smooth finish, just like I used to have back home," said one visitor from Europe, smiling

over a shared tray of pastries. The cafes interior adds to the appeal. Warm lighting, soft seating and quiet corners make Kyfesto feel intimate and unhurried—a welcome contrast to the often hectic pace of sightseeing. Many visitors linger

for long conversations, working sessions or simply to recover from a day of exploring Jaipur's bazaars and monuments. Staff are attentive without being intrusive, and the simple, welcoming hospitality helps international guests relax quickly. Food at Kyfesto is designed to complement the coffee rather than overshadow it. Light plates, sandwiches, freshly baked goods and a few comforting mains make for easy pairing. What's striking is the genuine trust visitors place in the café. Many tourists say they discovered Kyfesto through word of mouth or social media and ended up returning more than once during their stay. "It felt like finding a small piece of home in Jaipur," one traveller told us, adding that the unpretentious atmosphere and consistent coffee quality made Kyfesto a highlight of the trip.

Sitharaman to visit Jaipur on September 27 for 'Next Gen GST' campaign
