The chants of ‘Har Har Mahadev’ echoed across the ghats as the laser show enhanced the beauty of the festival. This year, the Dev Deepawali celebration at Dashashwamedh Ghat was themed “Operation Sindoor.” CM Yogi enjoyed the entire event from a cruise on the Ganga. Prime Minister Narendra Modi extended his greetings for Dev Deep-

awali and also watched the festival online. Tourism Minister Jaiveer Singh, Minister of State Ravindra Jaiswal, MLA Dr. Neelkanth Tiwari, District Panchayat Chairperson Poonam Maurya and Mayor Ashok Tiwari also lit diyas and paid tribute to Mother Ganga. The Chief Minister greeted the public and visiting tourists by waving towards the crowd.

Russia Prepares for Nuclear Tests Amid Tensions



Moscow: Russia’s Defense Minister Andrei Belousov has reportedly suggested to President Vladimir Putin that preparations begin immediately for potential nuclear weapons testing at the Novaya Zemlya archipelago in the Arctic. The proposal marks one of the most direct indications yet that Moscow could move to resume nuclear testing, a practice suspended globally for decades under the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty (CTBT). According to Kremlin sources cited by state media, Belousov briefed Putin on readiness measures and testing capabilities at the Novaya Zemlya site — the same remote region where the Soviet Union conducted hundreds of nuclear tests during the Cold War. President Putin, while not confirming any imminent tests, warned that Russia would take “appropriate measures” if the United States or other CTBT signatories proceed with their own nuclear experiments. “If others begin to test, we will not stand aside. Russia will respond accordingly,” Putin said, underscoring the Kremlin’s stance that Moscow’s nuclear deterrence must remain “credible and operational under any circumstance.”

Vasundhara Raje in Anta: “Link Every Chain — Elect Morpal Suman” Former Chief Minister urges unity, loyalty, and local pride in BJP ranks

Anta: Former Chief Minister Vasundhara Raje on Wednesday transformed a routine BJP workers’ meeting in Anta into a forceful appeal for unity and local representation. Addressing the Dehat Mandal cadre, Raje called on voters to “link every chain” by electing Morpal Suman, describing him as Anta’s “own son” and the only true local candidate. “The people of Anta chose the BJP for five years in 2023. Three years of our mandate still remain,” she said. “Whatever promises we make, we will fulfill them in the remaining term. Anta’s faith in us will not be broken.” Raje drew a sharp distinction between Morpal and other contenders, asserting that while others



come from outside the constituency, Morpal represents the soil and sentiment of Anta. “When the BJP governs in Delhi under Narendra Modi and in Jaipur under Bhajan Lal Sharma, the link must not break at the local level,” she declared. “Strengthen the chain — vote for Morpal Suman.” Framing the contest as a clash between privilege and grassroots struggle, Raje said the election was a fight between “the rich and the poor, the powerful and the farmer.” She appealed to voters to stand with the honest and hardworking. “Morpal is sincere, service-oriented, and clean in public life,” she said. “Development must be in the hands of those who understand local pain.” Raje’s speech combined emotion with strategy, reminding party workers that stability and continuity depend on discipline at every level. The event also saw the presence of Member of Parliament Dushyant Singh, who echoed her message of unity and loyalty. As the meeting concluded with chants of “Bharat Mata Ki Jai”, Raje’s words left a resonant message — that Anta’s political strength lies in its people, and in their ability to keep every link of the BJP’s chain unbroken.

Maharashtra Becomes First Indian State to Partner with Elon Musk’s Starlink



Maharashtra inks landmark pact for satellite-based internet connectivity

Mumbai: In a historic step toward bridging the digital divide, Maharashtra has become the first Indian state to sign a Letter of Intent (LOI) with Elon Musk’s Starlink Satellite Communications Pvt. Ltd. to provide satellite-based internet services across remote and underserved regions. The agreement was formalized in Mumbai during a meeting between Starlink Vice President Lauren Dreyer and state officials. The partnership aims to bring high-speed internet connectivity to government institutions, rural communities, and critical public infrastructure in districts like Gadchiroli, Nandurbar, Dharashiv, and Washim. Officials said the collaboration will strengthen Maharashtra’s Digital Maharashtra Mission and align with the state’s EV, coastal development, and disaster resilience programs. With this initiative, Maharashtra positions itself at the forefront of India’s satellite-enabled digital revolution, reinforcing Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s Digital India vision from the grassroots up.

“Vote Chori or Vote Theory? — Rahul Gandhi’s ‘H-Files’ and the Politics of Perception”

Jaipur: There was thunder in the air today — not in the sky, but at the Congress headquarters. Rahul Gandhi, armed with what he called “The H Files,” dropped what he described as a political hydrogen bomb. His claim: Haryana’s 2024 election was stolen. His charge sheet: 25 lakh fake votes, a Brazilian model voting 22 times, CCTV footage wiped clean, and the Election Commission in bed with the ruling party. But beneath the spectacle, the noise, and the theatricality — what survives of substance? Let’s strip each allegation bare.

The 25 Lakh “Fake Votes” Claim

Rahul Gandhi thundered that Haryana’s voter rolls carry 25 lakh bogus entries — one in every eight voters.

He offered numbers: 5,21,619 duplicates, 93,174 wrong addresses, 19 lakh “bulk voters.”

Reality check:

The Election Commission says not a single formal objection, petition, or request for roll rectification was filed by Congress during the statutory revision window. In fact, for 90 constituencies, only 22 election petitions exist — routine in any poll. If the data was this explosive, why wait a year? Why no affidavits, no PILs, no formal complaints? Democracy is protected through due

process, not press conferences. Verdict: A big claim without procedural follow-up is not revelation; it’s rhetoric.

The Brazilian Model Saga

Perhaps the most viral visual of the day: the photograph of a Brazilian model — whose face, Rahul said, was used 22 times under Indian names like Seema, Sweety, Saraswati, and Pooja.

It was powerful imagery, yes. But power is not proof.

Experts quickly pointed out that voter rolls display generic placeholders when photos are missing or distorted. The resemblance could easily stem from



stock-photo duplication during software data merges — not necessarily a 22-time voting spree by a foreign face. The Congress IT cell owes the nation more than shock value — it owes verification. Verdict: Symbolism strong, substantiation weak.

Allegation of EC–BJP Nexus

Rahul Gandhi accused the

Election Commission of collusion — alleging it “no longer wants fair elections” and acts as BJP’s silent partner.

The EC’s counterpunch was swift and surgical: it reminded Gandhi that the Congress had supported the EC’s own initiative, Project ‘SIR’, meant to weed out duplicate voters. So, is he now opposing the very system that would fix what he calls fraud?

To attack the referee every time you lose a match may win applause in your dressing room — but it erodes faith in the game itself. Verdict: Dangerous narrative. Questioning institutions without evidence risks corroding democracy itself.

CCTV Tampering & Vanishing Footage : He alleged that CCTV cameras at polling stations were deliberately blurred, erased, or switched off, to allow multiple voting.

That’s a criminal charge — and if true, it would rock the nation. But so far, no footage, no booth-level complaint, no police report, no RTI reference has been presented.

An accusation without timestamps, booth IDs, or certified footage is not evidence — it’s theatre.

Verdict: Until proof surfaces, this remains an unverified narrative weapon. “One House, 200 Voters” & Cross-State Duplication

Gandhi displayed slides of houses with zero or missing numbers, and vot-

ers registered in both Haryana and Uttar Pradesh.

Yes — such anomalies exist across India, often due to migrant labour patterns, clerical errors, and outdated databases. That’s why periodic roll revisions and BLO verification drives exist. Congress cadres at the block level are part of that process too.

So the question flips back: where were the Congress’s own local agents when these verifications were carried out? Verdict: Real issue, wrong theatre. Needs administrative fixing, not grandstanding.

“An Entire State Has Been Stolen” Rahul Gandhi ended with a flourish: “How has an entire state been stolen?” But Haryana’s 2024 result was not a

landslide — it was a hung verdict, followed by coalition-building. Congress improved its vote share. If a theft occurred, it seems oddly selective — robbing them of victory but gifting them gains.

Grand conspiracy theories often collapse under the weight of arithmetic. Verdict: Emotionally charged, statistically hollow. Rahul Gandhi’s “H Files” has energy, flair; and political theatre — but democracy demands evidence, not entertainment. If his team truly possesses concrete data — let them file affidavits before the Election Commission, Supreme Court, or forensic audit bodies. Otherwise, these remain slogans dressed as statistics.

Mother kills two-year-old son, jumps into well; neighbour leaps in to save her life

Tragic incident in Mokhampura village, Chittorgarh — family dispute suspected behind the act

Chittorgarh: A heart-wrenching incident took place on Wednesday afternoon in Mokhampura village under Bhadsoda police station area. A woman strangled her two-year-old son to death and then attempted suicide by jumping into a well. However, a brave neighbour jumped in after her and saved her life. The shocking incident has left the entire village in disbelief.

Rukmani strangled her son and hung his body : According to Bhadesar DSP Anil Shar-



ma, Rukmani Jat (28), wife of Madanlal Jat (30), resident of Mokhampura village in Leswa Gram Panchayat, strangled her two-year-old son Ayush with a rope and hung his body inside the house. After that, she ran straight towards the village well.

Neighbour’s quick action saved her life: Some women were washing clothes near the well when Rukmani suddenly ran towards it and jumped in

before anyone could react. Hearing their screams, farmer Omkar Lal Jat — who is also her neighbour — rushed to the spot. Without wasting a second, he jumped into the well, tied a rope around Rukmani, and with the help of people standing above, pulled her out safely. His timely bravery saved her life.

Truth revealed during police questioning: Police reached the spot and took Rukmani into custo-

dy. During questioning, she shockingly confessed that she had killed her son. When the police went to her house, they found the child’s body hanging from a rope. The body was sent to Sawaliya Ji Hospital for post-mortem.

Husband was working in the field : Rukmani’s husband, Madanlal, told police that both of them were working in the field. Around 3 p.m., Rukmani told him she was tired and wanted to go home and rest. A short while later, the incident took place.

Elder brother filed the report : The report of the incident was filed by Madanlal’s elder brother, Kishanlal Jat. Bhadsoda SHO Mahendra Singh said the woman is in custody

and being questioned. The exact reason behind the murder and suicide attempt is yet to be confirmed.

Villagers cite family disputes and mental stress : According to locals, Rukmani often quarreled with family members and had been mentally disturbed for some time. Police suspect that a family dispute may have driven her to the extreme act.

Her parental home is in Nada Kheda, Dungla :Rukmani’s parental home is in Nada Kheda village under Dungla tehsil of Chittorgarh district. After marriage, she had been living with her husband and family in Mokhampura.

‘Directionless 55-year-old youth leader’: Madan Rathore reacts to Rahul’s remarks on Army, ECI

Jaipur: Rajasthan unit BJP chief Madan Rathore, reacting sharply to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi’s recent remarks about the Indian Army and the Election Commission, has said that when a 55-year-old “youth leader” loses direction and makes incoherent statements, the entire nation ends up paying the price for his recklessness.

Rathore alleged that whenever elections draw near, the Congress, as well as party MP Rahul Gandhi, resort to their “anti-national toolkit”, targeting key democratic insti-

tutions such as the Constitution, the Judiciary, the Election Commission, and criticise even the Armed Forces. Their sole aim, he said, is to create confusion, spread anarchy, and undermine democracy for political gain. Terming the Congress leader’s accusations against the Election Commission as “false, baseless, and devoid of evidence”, Rathore said that if there were any discrepancies in the voter list, they should be reported to the poll panel with proof. “Instead, Rahul Gandhi prefers to level allegations publicly to mislead citizens,” the BJP leader said. Rathore added

that Rahul Gandhi has been repeatedly pulled up by the judiciary for making unfounded claims. “He himself once admitted that protecting India’s democracy is not his job -- proving that his real intent is to weaken it. He collaborates with foreign forces to damage India’s democratic institutions. After spending months abroad, he returns only to apply the divisive ideas he absorbs there,” the Rajasthan BJP chief remarked. He claimed that Rahul Gandhi’s statements ahead of the Bihar elections reflect his frustration over an impending defeat.

Major Success for Chittorgarh Police — Stolen Bullet Motorcycle Recovered, Two Accused Arrested

Chittorgarh: Kotwali police have achieved a major breakthrough by recovering a stolen Royal Enfield Bullet motorcycle that was taken from the Municipal Colony area. Two accused have been arrested in the case, while a third suspect remains absconding. District Superintendent of Police Manish Tripathi informed that on October 23, complainant Jeevanlal Dangi, a resident of the Municipal Colony, reported that his Bullet motorcycle, parked outside his



house at night, had been stolen. Based on the report, a case was regis-

tered, and an investigation was initiated.

To curb the rising inci-

dents of theft in the city, a special team was formed under the guidance of

ASP Sarita Singh, the supervision of DYSP Vinay Chaudhary, and the leadership of Station House Officer Tulsiram. Using technical surveillance and human intelligence, the team detained two suspects — Vikas, son of Chhaganlal Khatik (22), and Harish Tailor, son of Udaylal Tailor (19), both residents of Ghosunda. During interrogation, the accused confessed to stealing the motorcycle along with another accomplice by breaking the handle lock during the night. Based on their informa-

tion, the stolen motorcycle was recovered.

The search for the third absconding accused is currently underway

The police team that carried out the successful operation included Station House Officer Tulsiram, Assistant Sub-Inspector Laxman Singh, and constables Rajkumar, Hariram, Kailash, Sunil Kumar, and Rajesh from the Cyber Cell. Their coordinated efforts and prompt action led to the swift recovery of the stolen motorcycle and the arrest of the accused.

Jhunjhunu Police Tighten Noose on Rohit Godara–Virendra Charan Gang:

₹4.92 Lakh Cash, 5 Phones Seized in Singhana Raid

Jaipur: In a major breakthrough against organized crime, Jhunjhunu Police have struck a significant blow to the Rohit Godara–Virendra Charan gang, seizing 4.92 lakh in cash and five mobile phones during a raid on gang associate Rahul Swami alias Rahul Rinau’s relatives in Singhana town. The raid, carried out under the direction of Superintendent of Police Brijesh Jyoti Upadhyay, targeted the residence of Rahul’s sister Kajal and her husband Shivgautam Swami in the Banwas area. Both are now being questioned by the police regarding their alleged financial and logistical support to the gang. SP Upadhyay confirmed that the operation was based on technical surveillance and inputs from recently arrested accused Rohan Gurjar alias Chechi alias Jaspal, who is believed to be a key link in the network. “Preliminary investigation indicates that Kajal and Shivgautam were in active contact with gang

member Rahul Swami and were helping him with both local intelligence and funds,” the SP said.

Police sources said the couple failed to produce valid documents for the seized cash and mobile phones. Investigators are also probing the source of income behind their two-storey house and a business outlet named “Marudhar Trading”, which deals in building materials and operates from a large plot in Singhana.

The raid was part of a larger crackdown operation led by Additional SP Devendra Singh Rajawat and Circle Officer Noparam Bhakar, with teams drawn from Singhana, Pacheri Kalan, and Buhana police stations. The operation aims to dismantle the financial and operational network of the gang that has been active across parts of Rajasthan and Haryana. Police officials indicated that more raids are likely in the coming days as surveillance intensifies on the gang’s money trail and its linkages to local businesses.
